Synopsis 1

I present myself to this new project as an explorer of "non-places", places of transit and anonymity according to the anthropologist Marc Augé. Places that, at first, invite us to leave, places where we are not used to being guests: airports, hotel rooms, subway stops, a hidden alley.

Somehow, these places, sometimes very busy and sometimes totally abandoned, are a habitable canvas that transforms the way I relate to time and space, they contain invisible information that traps me. What happens when all the spaces I pass through become non-places, when my house also becomes a place of passage and nature imposes itself as a common space, without walls or doors, like the one found by the animals in the uninhabited cities near Chernobyl.

The term "Aurunca" refers to a train station in southern Italy, one of those unusual places I have visited, but which on this occasion symbolizes an obligatory stop, a moment of reflection. Perhaps, someday, we will assume that our sense of identity can also unfold in all its splendor in the itineraries.







Elías Aguirre

1979 Alicante, Spain

Multidisciplinary creator, dancer, choreographer, photographer, visual and audiovisual artist. Graduated in Fine Arts, he studied at the professional dance conservatory of Madrid RCPD Mariemma, Master in Performing Arts (URJC). In 2008 he began to develop his own projects. Her works are characterized by the convergence of contemporary dance techniques, urban dance, gestural theater and a constant inspiration in the "invisible nature". In 2010 he became a member of the resident companies of the Ayuntamiento de Madrid. His pieces have won several international awards (First Prize Ibero-American Alicia Alonso, First Prize Burgos New York ...) and have been performed at festivals on five continents.

His creations include '87 grillos' (2008), the multi-award winning 'Entomo' (2009), 'Escuálido Marsupial' (2010), 'Longfade' (2011), 'Lucha o Vuelo' (2012), 'Flightless' (2015), 'Shy Blue' (2016), 'Pez esfinge' (2017), 'Puk e Nuk' (2018), 'Rarewalk' (2018), 'Insecto Primitivo' (2019), 'Open Body Talks' (2019), 'Empusa Poem' (2020), 'Seismic Orchestra' (2020), 'Flowerheads' (2021), 'Flowerheads Show' (2022), 'This is Alfred' (2023), 'Aurunca' (2023) & 'Luoghi' (2024). 'Moving-Pause' e is a proprietary methodology he teaches in his workshops. Aguirre is artistic director of the Festival Cuerpo Romo (10 editions) and the Certamen Vallecas Danza (6 editions).
